Slan go foill.

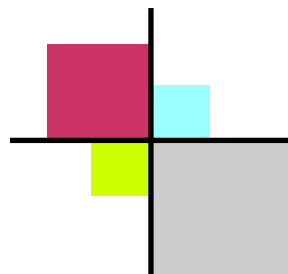
